Dear Ethics Commission:

I received a notice that I was past due on filing my January 2010 Receipts and Expenditure Report.

I did not know that this was due, since the election was in 2008 and there has not been any campaign.

I opened a bank account for the campaign, because initially I thought I would do more than just fill a spot on the ballot.

After agreeing to run, my job became so busy that campaigning was impossible- so I did not solicit nor accept any funds from anybody- which an examination of my account would show.

I did not receive any contributions, cash any checks or conduct any campaign.

I closed the bank account I had opened at Capital Federal in 2009- the only deposit into it was \$100 which I deposited and which I then took out when the account was closed. It is my understanding that it is acceptable practice to return money to the donor. The only money received or check cashed was the \$100 I deposited which was my own money.

Since the election was in 2008, and since there has been no campaign of any kind - certainly nothing since the election- I do not understand why this past due notice for 2009 activity was sent.

If I have to fill out a Campaign form re-stating this I will do so gladly.

Also, please note that although my wife, Jan Glauberman, was listed in 2008 as the campaign Treasurer, she did not act in any capacity to do anything for the campaign- there was no campaign- and she asked that I remove her name as Treasurer-- which I did not do, since there was no campaign.

There were not any public events, campaign literature, yard signs, buttons or any campaigning.
