I, Dana K Webber, ran for the House of Representatives in the 54<sup>th</sup> Kansas District during the primary. We filed my Termination Report ending on Jan. 10, 2013. With a forgiveness balance of \$866.57 owed to me for campaign expenditures.

On Feb. 4, 2013 in the US Mail I received a check in the amount of \$90.00 listed on the stub as an overpayment for a political ad. Since I didn't recognize the company "Morris Publishing Group" out of Augusta, Georgia, I researched and determined it was for an internet ad I had placed with the Capitol Journal "CJONLINE". I had requested the ad to run for 3 different dates, including the date of the Primary, August 7. The narrative on the check indicated it was for that date, August 7, 2012.

I wanted to advise you of the refund and apply it toward the personal debt I incurred because of running for office. I would like it to be a reimbursement toward my original debt. That would then reduce my original debt owed to me to \$776.57.
