Dear Ethics Commission:

Pursuant to my telephone conversation yesterday with Karina Renna in your office and per her request I'm writing this letter to reduce to writing our discussion as it pertains to my Receipts and Expenditures Report dated July 25, 2016.

Item number 4 noted in your Notification of Material Error letter dated October 26, 2016 is regarding a check from the Legislative Victory Fund dated May 20, 2016 in the amount of \$500.00 which was payable to me personally as reimbursement of expenses for running the 39th District Caucus in Garden City. Rather than put the check in my personal checking account I thought the money would be better served helping my campaign. I wasn't considering the date the check was issued, as it was never really a donation to the Worf for Senate campaign. In hindsight, however, I can understand the confusion and how it occurred. We have included a copy of the check to help clarify.

Item number 1 in the same Notification is the matter of who paid my filing fee. I was asked, and agreed, to run for the 39th District Senate seat by Chris Reeves and other ranking members of the Kansas Democratic Party just days before the filing deadline. As I understand it, Chris Reeves paid the filing fee May 31st, the day before the deadline. I can provide a written statement from Mr. Reeves if necessary.
